

2017/18 Council Tax Increase

Although your Council Tax bill is sent out under the Mole Valley District Council banner it includes the much larger amounts of tax needed by Surrey Police and Surrey County

Council to cover the broad range of public services throughout Surrey including highways maintenance, education, health, social care etc. etc.

As a Council Tax payer I am pleased that the Leader of the Conservative Group of County Councillors at Surrey County Council (SCC) was able to somehow enlist the assistance of the Conservative Government in Westminster to reduce the proposed 15% increase down to a fraction under 5% including the compulsory 3% for the increasing costs of social care. It is all very well the opposition, whether it be the LibDems or Labour, saying the Government should continue to subsidise the Local Authorities and artificially keep Council Tax below the real cost of local services but where is the money coming from?

For too many years the overspending has been financed by borrowed monies whether it be government bonds or credits from the IMF or the World Bank. A fact barely mentioned in the overspending plans of the LibDems and Labour is the interest on these loans takes a substantial chunk out of the taxes that we all pay in one form or another leaving less for services. This carries the very real risk of us becoming like a bankrupt Greece!

Highways

I have again reported the dangerous and increasing dip just beyond the last house after The Tree travelling eastwards along Boxhill Road. Also, the worsening potholes nearer to The Tree and those close to the junction with Headley Heath Approach. Hopefully, despite the financial constraints at Surrey Count Council, these will get dealt with promptly in the financial year starting in April.

There are a few smaller potholes and dips along Boxhill Road travelling eastwards towards the entrance to Dukes Wood that I have also reported.

Payment Diversion Alert

Fraudsters are emailing members of the public who are expecting to make a payment for property repairs. The fraudsters will purport to be a tradesman who has recently completed work at the property and use a similar email address to that of the genuine tradesman. They will ask for funds to be transferred via bank transfer. Once payment is made the victims of the scam soon realise they have been deceived when the genuine tradesman requests payment for their services.

Protect yourself

- Always check that the email address is identical to previous correspondence with the genuine contact.
- For any request of payment via email verify the validity of the request with a phone call to the person who carried out the work.
- Check the email for spelling and grammar as these signs can indicate that the email is not genuine.
- Payments via bank transfer offer no financial protection; consider using alternative methods such as a credit card or PayPal which offer protection and an avenue for recompense.

ACTIONS YOU CAN TAKE TO AVOID DOORSTEP CRIME

Spotting bogus officials: Bear the following in mind if you suspect that an 'official' caller may not be genuine:

- Water company officials do not need to access your home to test water pressure or repair a leak
- If they do need to access your home, they will write to you to arrange a suitable appointment
- Gas or electricity company officials expect you to check their identity before letting them in. They don't mind waiting why you do so
- If you have any doubts, don't let the caller in. Telephone the company to confirm they are genuine. Use a number from a utility bill and not one the caller gives you
- Set up a password system with your utility providers. This is a free service.

Bogus workmen can be very persistent in persuading you that urgent work needs to be carried out on your property. Our advice is:

- Never agree to have work done by someone who turns up on your doorstep. Say no.
- ➤ If your home need repair, use reputable workmen recommended by family and friends.

NEW £1 COIN – 28th March

A new 12-sided £1 coin will be rolled out on 28 March, the government has announced. The old 'round pound', which was introduced more than 30 years ago, will be in circulation alongside the new coin until it ceases to be legal tender on 15 October 2017. People are being urged to return the £1 coins

before they lose their legal tender status. They can either spend them before 15 October or bank them.

Around £1.3 billion worth of coins are stored in savings jars across the country, and the current £1 coin accounts for nearly a third of these, the government said. Some of the round £1 coins returned by the public will be melted down and reused to make the new £1 coin, which was announced in the 2014 Budget.

The new £1 coin, which resembles the old threepenny bit, has been hailed as "the most secure coin in the world". It boasts several new security features, including a hologram.

Replacing £1 notes, £1 coins were first launched on 21 April 1983. The Royal Mint has produced more than 2.2 billion round pound coins since that time. But there have been concerns about round pounds being vulnerable to sophisticated counterfeiters. Around one in every 30 £1 coins in people's change in recent years has been fake.

When the new coin enters circulation on 28 March, it might take a little while for people to start seeing it in their change as it gradually filters into general use. The new coin is made of two metals, with a gold-coloured outer ring and a silver-coloured inner ring. It has an image that changes from a £ symbol to the number 1 when the coin is seen from different angles. It also has very small lettering on both sides of the coin and milled edges. It is thinner and lighter than the round pound, but its diameter is slightly larger.





The writer of the book, Margaret Mitchell (right) was born in Atlanta and her book mirrored her own life to a certain extent, her fiancé went off to war and was killed. Her first husband turned out to be a very unsavoury character but her marriage to her second husband was a success. Margaret was very accident prone, standing beside a fire her dress caught alight and her legs were very badly burned. She survived two



car accidents and, once, when out horse riding the horse fell and crushed both her legs. At a party a shelf fell off the wall and a bottle of whisky knocked her unconscious! She was not a very confident person and after writing her book did nothing about it. A friend, who had read it, told a publisher about it; he visited Margaret and asked to see the book but she refused to let him publish it.

Two other friends were very scathing about the thought of Margaret being able to write a book and this made her change her mind and she let the publisher take the book. The volume was very long, over a million words!

The film rights of the film were bought in 1936 by David O. Selznic for \$50,000 and the hunt for actors to star in the film got underway. Selznic wanted Clark



Gable to play Rett Butler but he was under contract to MGM and a big problem was that Louis B. Mayer was Selznic's father-in-law. Interestingly, amongst other actors to be considered for the part were Charles Chaplin and Basil Rathbone. After numerous film tests by a great number of the leading actresses of the time Vivien Leigh, a then barely known English actress, was chosen to play Scarlet.

The book was so long there were numerous re-writes to get it down to a manageable length but it still lasted three hours and fortytwo minutes with an interval in the middle

and took nine months to make at a cost of \$4 million. The amazing scene of the burning of Atlanta was in fact the burning of the set of the film "King Kong" and, because it had been kept a secret, the neighbours in the area were so alarmed they called the fire brigade!

It won many awards at the Oscars, Best Actress, Vivien Leigh, Best Supporting Actress, Hattie McDaniel - the first Afro-American to win an Oscar - Best Director, Screenplay, Cinematography, Interior Decoration and Editing.

Sadly, Margaret Michel died shortly after the film came out. She was walking down a street and, without looking, stepped out into the roadway and was hit by an off-duty taxi driver who was drunk.

Celia thanked David for is fascinating talk. After the drawing of the raffle the meeting closed with one of Celia's funnies and Celia wishing everyone a safe journey home.

We have a busy few months coming up. March is our Birthday meeting when we will celebrate with a buffet provided by all members. School to Close after 72 Years



Bramley School in Chequers Lane, Walton-on-the-Hill, will close at the end of this summer term following a decision by the school Governors to amalgamate with two schools at Banstead, Greenacre Junior School and Priory School, and create a new Banstead Preparatory School to be located at the current Greenacre School site.

Bramley School was founded in 1945 by two teachers called Miss Chambers and Miss Flint (known as Flinty) as a day school for boys from age 5 to 8, and girls from age 5 to 12 or 13.

Looking for a suitable property, they found an empty house, uninhabited and locked up. It had been used during the war by the Canadian Army as an officers' mess – which is exactly what it was inside. The place was filthy – every door had been kicked down, fires had been started on floors, stair banisters had been used as logs for the fires, all the stair-treads were broken.

After substantial repair and redecoration, the school opened for business in September 1945, and local people helped them stock it with desks, chairs and textbooks. There were 50 pupils in that first term, and the school roll never dropped below that number.

There were just three classrooms at that time - one downstairs and two upstairs. Miss Chambers and Flinty lived 'above the shop' so to speak. In due course, they raised enough money from parents to build what was known as 'The Hut'. This was used for all school gatherings. 'The Hut' no longer exists in that form, but has been expanded substantially and is now where the kitchen, dining-room and main performing area is.

In those early days there were only a few other teachers employed at the school, most notably Miss Butcher who had been at the school since it opened. She had come over from her native France to marry a local Englishman, and taught French at Bramley until she was forced to retire — in her 90s! — in 1990. She was a delightful person and a loyal servant of the school, and eventually died aged 103, maintaining close links till the very end with the school which she visited regularly.

During the early 1970s, Flinty retired and, to safeguard the future of the school, it became an Educational Trust, with a Board of Governors. During her thirty years at Bramley, Miss Chambers spent just one day ill in bed. According to her, on that day she left her class working alone in the classroom opposite her bedroom. They put their work outside her bedroom door at the end of each lesson for her to correct, after which she put it back outside the classroom door for them to pick up. She said that she never heard a sound from the pupils all day. How times have changed

Brian always wanted to help others. He was always cracking a joke with a broad smile or a cheeky grin. He delighted in the fact that when he reached seventy-five he qualified for a free TV license, such was his humour.

Brian was a lovely man and a true gentleman, and will be much missed not only by his loving family but by everyone who knew him.



We wish them well.







Computer User's Corner



Goodbye Vista...

11 April 2017 will have significance to you if you have a Windows Vista machine - from this date forward your Vista installation will be unsupported.

But what does this really mean?

Your PC will continue to work, but you will not receive any updates from Microsoft. Superficially you may think this doesn't present a problem, but this is not the case if you use the internet.

The probability is you use your machine for online banking, shopping and/or social media like Facebook. They will see your machine as being not up-to-date and unsecure, so you will represent a breech to their security and they will stop you accessing their services.

Many browsers like Internet Explorer and Google Chrome have stopped supporting Vista. There are non-mainstream browsers that will work, but all you are doing is delaying the inevitable of having to replace the machine.

We can copy all your data and settings from your machine to a new one and offer advice as to what you need to be looking for in a new machine.

Fake warnings....

Rather than the usual Microsoft scam where someone phones you up and claims to be from Microsoft, you get a pop-up message on your screen, usually when on the internet, claiming to be from them. We have seen a variety of different text options, sometimes claiming they have found a problem with your machine, stating you have a virus infestation that is now affecting others, or anonymous and suspicious activity is coming from your machine. They then provide you with a phone number saying it is for Microsoft and ask you to call them as soon as possible so they can fix the problem for you. If you get this type of pop-up message on your screen, we highly recommend that you DO NOT call this company. This is not Microsoft attempting to contact you about a fault; this is a scam.

We have experienced this problem on both PC and Macs. You probably have some malware on your machine and it could be doing all sorts of harm, so it does need to get resolved. Please contact us if you would like further information.

DOG GROOMING DAYS

We have seen a number of dogs coming in with sore and/or cracked paws. This is not unusual for this time of year. In fact trying to keep dogs paws healthy in the snow and ice, not to mention the salt and grit that gets put down

can be a problem. Paws can also be affected in the constant wet weather. I mention this because of the snow we had in January and although we are now in March, it is a good idea to keep this article to mind for the next snow and ice period, or wet weather especially if your dog's paws get caked in mud. These articles are done a month in advance for printing purposes, so I can be behind in mentioning some things that happened in January.

How many of us put down salt and grit on our paths and driveways, not to mention what gets put down on pavements and roads. Too much contact on your pets paws can lead to chemical burns, dryness to the point where the pads crack and can split open, allowing for infection and for dogs doing what comes natural to them - licking themselves clean. They are then ingesting the salts and this is toxic.

Dog owners need to keep their dogs off salted walkways - difficult I know, so always best to have a shallow bowl handy where you can put in WARM water and rinse your pet's paws and towel dry.

Another problem is the ice balls that collect between the toes and pads, that can cause very sore paws. Ideally pads should be kept trimmed to stop this from happening. Not easy if your pet is paw shy. Dogs out in the cold for too long are at risk of frost bite, cramp and/or hypothermia - just like people. It is therefore advisable to take short walks instead of one long one.

The following tips are extracted from an article posted by Rebecca West.

- Check and if necessary wash paws regularly, after each walk and going into your garden
- 2) Dogs paws can be toughened up by regular walks on hard flat ground, e.g. pavements, but how many dog owners do that.
- 3) Keep hair trimmed short
- 4) Moisturise the pads as it will help against cuts, cracking and peeling and do not forget the carpal pad located on the front legs back of wrist. Use a natural one. Should be able to get from most good pet shops
- 5) Try a good paw wax that can also be found in most good pet shops
- 6) To melt ice on driveways and pavements, use a safe non-toxic de-icer

- 7) If your dog will use them, you can always get dog booties. Remember dogs may not take to these straight away, so great patience is required, but do not be disheartened it they will not wear them.
- 8) Please be careful with antifreeze, some drops can easily end up on the ground and keep it out of reach of pets as you would a child. It has a sweet smell that attracts pets, but it is toxic and can kill
- 9) The juries out on the use of Vaseline. Some say it is safe to use, others say it is not. It contains petroleum jelly and if swallowed can cause diarrhoea in pets, but do not use on puppies

Now that we have entered March my waiting period to get a grooming appointment can be three weeks, so please bear in mind when planning your pets next grooming session.

Our current exhibition: Since Dorking Museum's spring exhibition opened, visitors have been intrigued by its portrayal of everyday life in a small medieval village in the 13th-15th centuries. **'Medieval Betchworth'**, mounted in association with the Betchworth Village Archives team, tells of the manor, the mill, the church and the villagers working on the land. Not just the sleepy rural life though, as more dramatic national and international events also impacted on the villagers. Half fell victim to the Black Death, which swept Europe in the 14th century and contributed to the Peasants' Revolt of 1381. At least three English kings passed through or stayed in the village, as well as the French Crown Prince Louis, whilst Thomas Morsted of Betchworth served as Henry V's chief surgeon at the Battle of Agincourt.

There is much drama and surprise in this neglected period of history. In April, Betchworth Archivist Jane Le Cluse will be giving one of our popular evening Gallery Talks, when she speaks on 'A Sense of Place: Medieval Betchworth': watch out for details next month.

We have opportunities for visitor assistants to welcome visitors to the Museum and volunteers for our team visiting care homes with reminiscence boxes that stimulate residents' memories. The Leith Hill Musical Festival has its first concert this month under its new conductor Jonathan Willcocks - a performance of Bach's great choral masterpiece, the *St Matthew Passion*. Then comes the youth choirs' day, in which some thirty school choirs and other young singers perform and compete - a veritable feast of young talent. The main festival competitions and concerts will follow in April.

Their programme has several concert favourites - including Grieg's *Holberg suite* and Holst's *St Paul's suite* - and it will also feature a performance of Hummel's brilliant and virtuosic trumpet concerto.

This month's lunchtime concert at **St Martin's church** will be given by soprano Alison Bishop plus pianist. Watermill Jazz meets every Tuesday evening with a different line-up of performers each week - details will be on the website.

And finally, there are two screenings at the **Dorking Halls**. Live from the Bolshoi in Moscow comes a programme of contemporary ballet; and from the Royal Opera House in London comes a live relay of Puccini's *Madame Butterfly*, a tragic story of love and self-sacrifice in an exotic Japanese setting.
