Introducing a new Surrey-wide service for Carers and what's happening to Carers Support Mole Valley

From 1st April 2017, Action for Carers Surrey (ACS) are providing a county-wide service for Carers. ACS are offering Carers a flexible range of support including:

- telephone support and advice
- local Carers meetings
- · face-to-face meetings, where needed
- support groups, and workshops.

In addition, there are also Carer Advisors in the county's five acute hospitals (locally East Surrey and Epsom).

What's happening to Carers Support Mole Valley (CSMV)?

Most of the Carer Support Schemes currently funded by Surrey County Council – including CSMV - closed their offices at the end of March. CSMV is working closely with ACS to make sure the transition to the new service is as smooth as possible for both Carers and employees.



Highways

Hurrah! and thank you to Surrey County Council for repairing the potholes near to The Tree and those close to the junction with Headley Heath Approach that I reported last month.

Hopefully, the smaller potholes and dips along Boxhill Road travelling eastwards towards the entrance to Dukes Wood, that I also reported last month, will soon also be repaired.

In addition to the above I have since reported the more recent and worsening potholes in the centre of Boxhill Road between the Water Works entrance and Fraser Heath House entrance. I have also requested that the drains be cleared to avoid flooding on Boxhill Road particularly at the junctions with Fort Road and the track to Chestnut Lodge Farm.

Please let me know if there are other potholes, breaking up surfaces etc that I may have missed. You can also help support my requests by reporting potholes, blocked drains etc. on the public highway direct to Surrey County Council Highways using the link below:

Housing shortages and protection of the Greenbelt

The Government has made it very clear that Greenbelt land will continue to be conserved and protected for the benefit of future generations. At the same time, more housing, particularly subsidised affordable housing for sale and rent, is needed to avoid the continued loss of young people who cannot afford a home within the beautiful area in which we are fortunate to live.

I believe this can only be achieved by some sympathetically controlled infilling within our towns and villages by a careful mixture of utilising redundant outdated commercial or industrial sites, the conversion of redundant outdated office buildings that are no longer needed due in part to the growing trend of the internet facilitating 'agile home working' that will also help reduce commuting and consequent pollution.

It seems that many people are unaware that the building of decent low cost housing is partly dependent on the building of other residential property by a compulsory affordable housing contribution of 20% on new developments of 5 or more homes in rural areas or 40% in built up areas. This is in addition to the newly created Compulsory Infrastructure Levy.

Housing shortages and protection of the Greenbelt (Continuation)

The affordable housing contribution can be in the form of housing on the development (i.e. one in five in rural areas or 4 in 10 in built up areas) or payment of the cost equivalent that the Local Council can use, or pass on to a housing association, to build affordable housing elsewhere preferably within the district of Mole Valley. Whilst this may not be a perfect solution it is working and delivering affordable homes for our adult children and grandchildren.

Reporting suspected breaches of Planning Regulations

I occasionally get asked by residents to follow up on possible breaches of Planning Consents and/or Regulations. Whilst I would like to continue to provide this service you can also help, if you wish, by reporting suspected breaches directly to Mole Valley Planning Enforcement online by logging onto:

Frequent breaks in electricity supply

Over the last year, we seem to have gone back to unacceptable frequent breaks in the electricity supply for some, if not all, of Box Hill. Last year it was the western end towards the Smith & Western and now it seems to be at the eastern end with over 70 homes affected on Warren Park and Brockham Hill Park. Whilst most breaks in supply are very short they are nevertheless very disruptive by affecting the running and the necessary resetting of electrical equipment that does not have auxiliary battery back-up.

I have tried to chase this up with UK Networks via PowerGen (now part of E-On) but with little success in getting satisfactory answers as to what is being done to prevent this continuing forever. Nevertheless, I am persevering with this.

ANOTHER BOX HILL by Bill Donnelly

Some of our readers might know that ours is not the only 'Box Hill' around the world. Within the UK, there is another Box Hill in Gloucestershire.

But one with more intriguing connections to our own Box Hill is the city area of Box Hill on the eastern outskirts of Melbourne, Victoria, in Australia! It is believed that this area was first settled by a squatter called Arundel Wrighte in 1838. More permanent settlers were Thomas and Edith Toogood – their real name – who purchased land there in 1841, and Wrighte even built a house called 'Marionvale' on his land three years later – the chimney stone of which still exists, incorporated into the building of the new Town Hall.

Later, after a main road was constructed through the district, a hotel named the White Horse Hotel was built there – and then the first Post Office was opened in 1861 – to be named by the Postmaster after his birthplace, our own Box Hill in Surrey, England.

Uniquely in 1921, after some agitation by local temperance missions, the sale of alcohol was prohibited in Box Hill, signalling the demise of the White Horse Hotel, which was finally demolished in 1931.

Anglican services were held in a small brick church, to become known as St Peter's, from 1883, and later buildings were finally destroyed by fire in 1949, with the Peace Memorial Church begun in 1951 and finally completed in 1971. It is particularly interesting that — as our own local church St Andrew's, along with its sister church, St Mary's, Headley is soon to become a three-some along with St Peter's Church in Walton on the Hill — the Melbourne Box Hill church of St Peter's is similarly aligned with two other churches, St Aidan's at South Box Hill founded in 1926, and St Philip's at North Box Hill founded more recently in 1953.


The growth of immigration from non-European sources has enhanced the culture and nature of Box Hill, Melbourne recently, with a 20% Chinese population alongside many other South East Asian communities, providing an eclectic range of restaurants, shops and other facilities.

As well as Association and "Aussie rules" football clubs, the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne stimulated a strong Box Hill Athletic Club, which operates alongside the Basketball and Aqualink Swimming Club facilities.

So – a much bigger suburban district than our own Box Hill Village – but nevertheless a lively and successfully multi-cultural community, with its name still proudly arising from that decision made by the emigrant Postmaster from Surrey 150 years ago!




DOG GROOMING DAYS

Boarding your pet

We are often asked if we can recommend a kennels. This is difficult, as not having any dogs myself I do not board out, nor

do my colleagues board out with their dogs. Also, if we could recommend one and something went wrong, we would feel bad that we had done so. What I can do is advise, and this is based on 26 years of working in a boarding kennels and cattery myself, 18 years as Manageress.



Plan and book well in advance. All good kennels and catteries will be booked up weeks if not months in advance. Frankly they are the ones to go to because they will be booked up for a reason - they are good. These good kennels and catteries will more than likely have a waiting list of people hoping for a cancellation. Any kennels and cattery that can take you at short notice, especially at busy times, please be a little wary of them. NEVER

take your pet to a boarding establishment that you are not allowed to view. Some boarding places may pin you down to an appointment time which means they know you are coming and can prepare. When I worked in a kennels and cattery you could view between 10am and 3pm; you did not have to warn us, just turn up.

All boarding establishments should be insured and have a good security system.

Try and go on recommendation from other pet owners. Although veterinary practices do not normally recommend, as they may have boarding establishments on their books, I knew of several vets that would say "Well if I was boarding my dog I would go to".



Obviously go on gut instinct - if you're not happy do not board. If you need somewhere at short notice, never just take the first available kennel out of desperation. If your holiday is more important than your pet, then you should not have a pet.

DOG GROOMING DAYS (Continuation)

These days there is a lot of home boarding, be it a sitter in your home or you taking your pet to their home. Again, always view the sitters home; if they will not let you, then do not go there. You must make sure that security is good and your dog cannot escape their garden. Some sitters will mix dogs. Are you happy with that? Are there children in the home? Is your dog OK with children? Is the sitter insured to look after your pet? For sitters coming to your home, they must be police checked, insured and make it clear what is expected from them in your home.



Wherever you take your pet, please make sure that whoever is looking after them knows what your pet's temperament is like, whether they can be an escapee, any medical problems and are they willing to give medication. Some kennels and catteries will not take a diabetic pet for instance, so all these things need to be mentioned in advanced and not on the day you take your pet in.

Although it will cost you more, I would always advise you

to break your pet in gently for boarding for the first time or in an establishment that you have never boarded before. One all night stay, followed by a long weekend, before you disappear off for a week, fortnight or longer break. This is better for your pet - they will know you have not left them forever because you came back for them. When you collect your pet, you can tell by its body language if your pet is happy, and whether they look alright - no urine smelling coat, gunky eyes or dirty bottom. If when you return them for a future board, are they petrified of going back in - that should tell you something.

Most boarding establishments are good, clean places run by people and staff who care and know their job. If you find a good one stick with it no matter if you move. We had people come from Scotland, Bedfordshire, Hertfordshire and Cambridgeshire, because they would not go anywhere else. Now that is the sort of kennels and cattery you need for your much-loved pet.

If you are supplying medication or own food, always make sure you are taking in more than is required, just in case you are delayed in getting back.

BEWARE: Dog owners are being warned to keep their dogs on a lead and out of the water at Virginia Water. The blue-green algae have appeared. If ingested by a dog, they could die within the hour. Please keep a look out for these algae in any pond or river.



The Secrets We Share by Emma Hannigan

This is the first time I have come across this author and I shall look out for her other books. Devastated after a tragedy, Nathalie Conway finds herself on a plane to Ireland to stay with her grandmother who, until now, she had no idea existed. A lovely family story.

On The Slow Train. Twelve Great British Railway Journeys by *Michael Williams* This book is paean to another age, before little country stations, with their milk churns, porters and slumbering cats on seats, were replaced by the modern world of security announcements, leaves on the line and Burger King. The author writes widely on railways for many publications including several daily newspapers and the railway specialist press. This is not just a railway book but is about the delights of the people and the countryside encountered on the slow trains of Britain.

There's something quite wonderful about spending time by a river and this is one of the most interesting and pretty stretches of the Mole. I've often seen kingfishers here so it's well worth keeping a sharp lookout."

The Beauty of Box Hill Farm (Continuation)

This is a two mile walk along some scenic sections of the River Mole and offering great views back towards Box Hill. As well as the natural scenery, there are some fascinating Second World War structures designed to stop tanks approaching London. The walk is just challenging enough to earn tea and cake when you get back to the top.



Over time we aim to extend our precious chalk downland grassland into the upper fields. Once the nutrient levels reduce, delicate annual plants and rare species, (like orchids and butterflies), will begin to re-establish themselves.

We have already scraped out a shallow channel of varying depths in one of the lower fields. Once flooded in the winter, we hope this will become naturally populated with rushes, reeds and sedges, offering habitat to wetland birds, amphibians and insects. It will be interesting to monitor how this progresses and how much wildlife it attracts. If successful we may do more of this sort of thing in the future.

The Riverside Walk can be enjoyed at any time of year; it comprises a gentle descent and steep climb with glorious views. The walk starts at Salomons Memorial viewpoint at the top of Box Hill, where there is also car parking, toilets and a café. This year's main works are: Vaughan Williams' *Dona nobis pacem* and Parry's *Blest pair of sirens* (Thur), Mendelssohn's *Elijah* (Fri), and Haydn's *Little organ mass* and Andrew Carter's *Benedicite* (Sat).

The Dorking Concertgoers present the third and final concert in the series given by the Piatti string quartet. Their concerts have focussed on the three string quartets of Brahms, and here they will complete the set by playing the third quartet. This is a relaxed piece with an opening movement in hunting style and a lovely Brahmsian intermezzo. One of Beethoven's greatest quartets, *op.130 in B flat*, a powerful work in six movements, will provide the final work from the Piatti quartet.

There is one **Opera Screening at the Dorking Halls**, a recording of Puccini's Madame Butterfly from the Royal Opera. This is a tragic tale of love betrayed, told through Puccini's powerful and highly emotional music. There are also three ballet screenings. Live from the Bolshoi in Moscow comes *A hero of our time*, a story about a young Russian officer, based on the classic novel by Lermontov (9th). *Jewels* comes live from the Royal Ballet and features the music of Fauré, Stravinsky and Tchaikovsky (11th). And finally, there is a recording of *Coppelia* from the Australian Ballet (27th).

Watermill Jazz meets each Tuesday. This month's programme is: a tribute to Bobby Wellins (4th), Patricia Barber (11th), and the Scott Hamilton quartet (18th). Please note there will be no concert on 25th as the usual venue is unavailable.



WHY PLAYING BOWLS IS GOOD FOR YOU ...



Dorking Bowling Club is holding its annual Open Day on Saturday 29th April from 10.30 to 12.30 and 2.00 to 4.00 at its green on Drill Hall Road, Dorking RH4 1GL. All ages and abilities are very welcome to have a go - just turn up with a pair of flat shoes. There will be several qualified (and very friendly) coaches on hand to show you what to do. All equipment will be provided.

If that wasn't enticement enough, here are a few of the health benefits of playing lawn bowls:

1. Bowls has a long, noble and quirky history.

Maybe not a direct health benefit but think Sir Francis Drake, Henry VIII, George Washington, all keen bowlers. In 1522 the Duke of Suffolk (possibly a bowling chum of Henry) was involved in an energetic game when his bowl split in two. Eager to continue, he rushed into the front hall of his grand home and removed the round cap from the staircase's newel post. Delighted to discover that the flat side of his replacement bowl gave him a game changing bias, he bowled his way into the history books. Bowls encourages mental agility.

2. It encourages self-discipline - you have to turn up on time for a match and you have to wear the correct uniform.

To be honest, we have all been to school so there shouldn't be too much of a problem here but will playing bowls be like going back to school (alarming and embarrassing)? Not unless your school allowed you to drink beer during a match and to stay on afterwards in the clubhouse to enjoy pleasant company without the worry of having to rush off to do your homework. This, of course, doesn't apply to members of school age!

WHY PLAYING BOWLS IS GOOD FOR YOU ...

(Continuation)

3. Fitness helps moderately improve muscle strength (arm, shoulder, leg muscles), flexibility and endurance.

The emphasis is on "moderately" here. Bowls is not an extreme sport. It is a gentle, polite game underpinned by a tactical and merciless competitiveness (unless you are playing in a Friendly, of course).

4. Social interaction helps improve social skills and being part of a team also gives you a sense of belonging.

If your favourite pastime is solitaire or bodybuilding, then perhaps the camaraderie of bowls won't suit. There's no doubt that once the quiet heat of battle is over, opposing teams retire to the clubhouse for friendly cakes and ale, cheery captains' speeches and good humoured conversation.

5. Increases skills – bowls involves some element of problem solving skills, and also helps improve coordination and concentration.

One set of "problems" to solve are the rules. At first, they seem complicated but there are at least two people in the club who understand "Bowls England – Rules and Regulations 2013 ed." almost in their entirety. The main thing is that other players are friendly and supportive, even though they may be on the opposing team. And it's certainly true that quiet concentration over a few hours of play can induce a pleasant Zen-like tiredness.

6. Above all it doesn't take long to grasp the basics of the game: lawn bowls is for people of all ages, abilities and fitness levels





Grace and love

"I used to be part of a wonderful community of Christians close to Watford. It was a church, it was Baptist, and it was in a town called Bushey. Rather unimaginatively but not surprisingly, it was called Bushey Baptist church. And there was a man there called Peter. At the time, I was working at the London School of Theology, but Peter knew that I was more than a little interested in what was going on out in the everyday working world. So, every now and then on a Sunday he'd come up to me and pass on a few newspaper articles about work, business or culture that he thought I might find interesting.

Is cutting out newspaper articles ministry? Or is it just a nice thing to do?

Now I had immense respect for Peter and loved his company, but I hadn't known him for that long and I wasn't in his home group and I don't think I had ever done anything in particular for him. But there he was, thinking of me as he read his newspaper on his daily commute, holding my interest close enough to his consciousness to spot an article that might interest me. 
