





BHNC PUBLIC MEETING – LOCAL PLANNING RESTRICTIONS REVIEW

Claire Mallalieu from MVDC Planning Department joined the meeting to present the review of Local Planning restrictions in small rural villages to help meet housing needs. She showed a map of Box Hill village boundaries. As part of the review it may be possible to suggest changes to the existing boundaries.

PARKING ON BOXHILL ROAD

The issue of vehicles parking on Boxhill Road opposite the Roof of the World has become a safety issue with several near misses. The options were discussed on possible solutions. It was agreed Hazel Watson and Malcolm Ladell would contact Surrey County Council (SCC) to ask for new waiting restrictions on Boxhill Road to be included in the next parking review. They have requested "no waiting" restrictions (i.e. double yellow lines) at:

- the junctions of Boxhill Road and Headley Heath Approach, Woodlands Park and Ashurst Drive; and
- alongside the dropped kerbs for Hi Hopes, Little Whispers, Casa Mia / Follies
 End and Beechwood on Boxhill Road

This reinforces the "no parking" regulations set out in Rule 243 of the Highway Code which states that there should be no parking "opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space" or "in front of an entrance to a property".

It was suggested that perhaps a mirror could be erected at the end of Headley Heath. Hazel Watson explained that SCC considered this unsafe and would not approve. Mirrors can be put on private land but would be the responsibility of the land owner.

ZIG-ZAG ROAD CLOSURE – EASTER WEEKEND

Zig Zag Road is to be **one-way only for all traffic**, including bicycles over Easter weekend because it is expected to be so busy. Traffic will only be allowed to travel up the road, from its junction with Old London Road at Mickleham up to the National Trust car parks at the summit of the hill.

ACTION FRAUD ALERTS

False claims of Telephone Preference Service: Fraudsters are cold-calling victims, falsely stating that they are calling from one of the well-known UK telecommunication service providers. They call victims claiming to provide a 'Telephone Preference Service' - an enhanced call-barring service, which includes barring international call centres.

The fraudsters ask victims to confirm/provide their bank account details, informing them that there is a one-off charge for the service. Victims instead see monthly debits deducted from their accounts, which they have not authorised. The fraudsters often target elderly victims.

In all instances, direct debits are set up without following proper procedure. The victim is not sent written confirmation of the direct debit instruction, which is supposed to be sent within three days.

On occasions when victims attempted to call back, the telephone number provided by the fraudster was either unable to be reached or the victim's direct debit cancellation request was refused.

Protect yourself:

- There is only one Telephone Preference Service (TPS). The TPS is the only
 official UK 'do-not-call' register for opting out of live telesales calls. It is FREE
 to sign-up to the register. TPS never charge for registration. You can register
 for this service at http://www.tpsonline.org.uk.
- You will receive postal confirmation of genuine direct debits. If you notice unauthorised payments leaving your account, you should contact your bank promptly.
- Always be wary of providing personal information or confirming that
 personal information the caller already claims to hold is correct. Always be
 certain that you know who you talking to. If in doubt hang up immediately.





Update: Malcolm Ladell

Mole Valley District Councillor for Box Hill & Headley

Future Mole Valley – Presentation by MVDC Planning Officer to Box Hill Neighbourhood Council Meeting on Monday 5th March 2018

As your Mole Valley District Councillor, I was present at the well-attended Box Hill Neighbourhood Council (BHNC) Meeting held in the Village Hall on 5th March. This was an important meeting as a Mole Valley District Council Planning Officer gave an outline and answered questions on what may be allowed and what may not be allowed to meet housing needs and help improve life in small semi-rural villages like Box Hill that are within both the Metropolitan Green Belt and an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) plus also adjacent to areas of Great Landscape Value, Special Scientific Interest and a Special Area of Conservation where no development is allowed.

Box Hill, like Headley, has a preponderance of an ageing population and it is increasingly difficult to ensure adequate support for maintaining local shops including the sub-post office and other community facilities for those who cannot easily travel to nearby Leatherhead, Dorking or Epsom. It is thought that building smaller less costly 1, 2 or 3-bedroom properties would bring younger people to help reinvigorate villages such as Box Hill and Headley.

There are also what seem to be anomalies; for example, planning rules are more relaxed on the eastern side compared to the western side of Headley Heath Approach. Similarly, along parts of Ashurst Drive and also along the northern side compared to southern side of parts of Boxhill Road. You may agree or disagree with these statements; either way it is important that you promptly let BHNC know your preferences.

The government has made it very clear that every local authority must consult with its residents, local Parish Councils, Residents Associations and/or Neighbourhood Councils prior to updating its Local Plan to take account of increased housing needs. If a local authority (i.e. MVDC) fails to promptly update its Local Plan it will be remotely updated by the Planning Inspectorate based in Bristol who will also take over the responsibility of dealing with all future local planning applications. To minimise the risk of decisions being taken either by MVDC without consultation with residents or ultimately by the Government Planning Inspectorate at Bristol the residents of Box Hill, either directly or preferably via BHNC, should promptly make the MVDC Planners know their preferences before Friday 21st April.

Update: Malcolm Ladell (Continuation)

Mole Valley District Councillor for Box Hill & Headley

Proposals for double yellow lines along parts of Boxhill Road were presented at the BHNC Meeting on Monday 5th March.

Whilst I have not been a keen supporter of double yellow lines, because I feel it suburbanises a semi-rural village such as ours, I now feel that we have little or even no choice in the interests of road safety and to avoid a serious or even fatal accident.

Alternative proposals of (1) no double yellow lines, (2) continuous double yellow lines for approximately ¾ of a mile from The Tree to Chestnut Lodge with broken lines allowing up to 2 hours parking at the doctor's surgery or (3) double yellow lines either side of adversely affected road or driveway junctions with Boxhill Road were presented to the meeting.

On a show of hands, the majority of those attending were in favour of proposal (3) resulting in SCC Councillor Hazel Watson for Surrey Hills and I, as your MVDC Councillor for Box Hill & Headley being requested to proceed with an application to Surrey County Council Highways. This will be followed by a public consultation of the Box Hill residents and, if the proposals are accepted by SCC Highways, the double yellow lines could be in place sometime in 2019.

Police 'drop-in sessions' every Monday lunchtime at MVDC Council Office, Pippbrook Dorking

Representations were made to Surrey Police upon the termination of their regular daily presence in the front office of the MVDC Pippbrook Dorking Council Offices. The change was being implemented due to cost savings to avoid cuts to essential response services.

However, following discussions between representatives of Surrey Police and Mole Valley District Council it was agreed that it is essential to maintain face to face contact with residents for reporting and solving crime.

Accordingly, it was agreed that 'a police drop-in session' will take place every Monday lunchtime from midday to 2pm when a member of Surrey Police will be present in Room 2 at the front office of MVDC Pippbrook Dorking to listen, advise and act upon issues brought to them in confidence.

Surrey Police are also considering moving their HQ from their costly outdated building in Guildford to somewhere in the Dorking/Leatherhead area of Mole Valley.

Planned Power Cut

The Advance Notice of the Planned Power Cut for an estimated 7 hours on 7th March was not delivered to the residents of Upper Farm Home Park as UK Power Networks were not aware of their post codes as they are not customers because their main supply cabling ends at the manager's bungalow and office that has a different post code. The supply cabling was presumably installed and remains privately owned by the site owners who were sent the Advance Notice of the Planned Power Cut and should have notified their tenants. Unfortunately, whilst the notice stated that '...if you live in a flat, apartment or maisonette please let other residents know about the Planned Power Cut by displaying this prominently in the building'. Although the site owner managers duly displayed the notice in the office window before going on holiday, the information did not get through to residents who rarely stop at the office when driving out or into Upper Farm Home Park, particularly when they know the managers are away.

Fortunately, I found out what had happened and delivered a note to every household on Upper Farm giving details of the Planned Power Cut and the contact details of UK Power Networks who promptly responded and provided essential onsite support for vulnerable residents.

If you live on a mobile home park I suggest you check if UK Power Network are aware of your existence and post code to ensure that you are informed of any Planned Power Cuts. The telephone number is 0800 3163105 which is a free call from a UK mobile phone or landline.

Surrey County Council Proposing to extend RideLondon to 2024

At the time of writing this on 19th March I have had no response from Surrey County Council to my communication that was detailed in the March issue of *Box Hill News*.






The Royal Family and their Animals by Brian Hoev


The Woman in Blue by Elly Griffiths

DOG GROOMING DAYS

PETLOG MICRO-CHIP REGISTRATION

What a sad world we live in when certain things happen with our dogs. I heard a group of Cocker Spaniel puppies

were stolen from their breeder, I believe Yorkshire way. One was found, but it appeared the thieves tried to take out the microchip and the wound became infected. The puppy was put to sleep by a vet. Also, a rescue organisation homed a dog. The micro-chip was registered to the rescue organisation and the new owner then informed the rescue that she had contacted Petlog and changed the details over the phone, without Petlog checking if this new owner was the rightful owner. The rescue rang Petlog, who informed them that if a dog is lost, the 'finder' if they have access to a scanner, can scan for the number, ring the microchip service and as long as the fee is paid the details will be changed. Petlog then went on and read a declaration over the phone, to tell the rescue service that if the dog's microchip is scanned, and the number retrieved, all details can be changed without the consent or permission of the previous owner or any proof of ownership. Makes you now wonder how many pets are with new owners, because details were changed so easily; and I wonder how many pet owners who went to the trouble of having their pet micro-chipped, have lost them because of this procedure? It's a worry.

Computer User's Corner

What to look for when buying a Computer

When buying a Computer or Laptop there is a whole heap of jargon that people throw at you with an expectation that you

should know what they are taking about- SSD's, Ram, MHz, Wifi, HDMI and so it goes. We have always felt this a very rude way to treat your fellow man, so "yes" we can talk jargon with you; we can also talk in finest English to ensure your needs are best met.

Here are a few key components you might appreciate knowing about before you buy your new machine.

The Central Processing Unit (CPU): This is the engine that powers the PC, so it is advisable to buy the best that you can, as CPU's are costly items and are not efficient to change or upgrade at a later stage. If your needs are for base Word processing and Excel type work, plus some Internet browsing and email handling, a basic Intel Dual Core Pentium, Core i3 CPU, or AMD A4 or A6 CPU would represent a good choice. If you are looking for something a bit more capable and a good all-round home machine, we would usually advise either an Intel Core i5 or i7 CPU. Intel have just launched the 8th Generation CPU, so there are some very good performing and great value machines with 6th and 7th Generation CPU's. There are model variations within these CPU's - but let's not get ahead of ourselves just yet.

Memory or Ram: The more the better, but this can usually be retro fitted. 4Gb of Ram is considered a minimum, going beyond 8Gb is often unnecessary. The latest, fastest DDR4 memory is nowadays standard fit and moves the performance of the machine on significantly, when compared to its earlier counterparts, and will offer solid performance for years to come.

Hard drives: The conventional mechanical hard drives have been using the same technology for around 20 years. They are very economic, have huge storage capacity, but can be slow. Upgrade to a Solid State Hard Drive (SSD) and the performance is phenomenal, they work at 15-20 times faster than the mechanical drives, they are more reliable (as they have no moving parts), but they cost more and have less storage capacity than the older type hard drives. If you need to store loads of data, a great solution is to have both in a machine, the SSD runs the Operating System and Programs and the mechanical drive stores your data.

Graphics cards: Game players, photo and video editors and graphics users are better served by having a dedicated graphics card installed, in some cases the graphics card can cost as much as the computer. In most cases using the onboard graphics is sufficient, and should you wish to upgrade the graphics this can sometimes be retrospectively added in a PC, but unfortunately rarely in a laptop.

Operating System: Windows is the dominant system here with Windows 10 being the preferred choice as it works in a very efficient manner and is the industry dominant product. Unlike earlier versions, Microsoft have stated that Windows 10 will be the operating system of the future, with the program being revised via updates rather than a distinctly separate new version. To date we are on the 4th major version with a new edition being scheduled for March/ April 2018.... and yes, the updates are free of charge.

Birch Tree Folk Choir uses specific breathing and singing exercises and techniques to work to realign the nervous system - allowing the body a chance to heal the physical and psychological impact of this ongoing stress."

A CITY BREAK TO PORTO IN PORTUGAL

EUROPEAN BEST DESTINATION 2017

I have just returned from a city break to this amazing city and would like to share my experiences with you all. We were due to leave on the day that Storm Emma and the Beast from the East would bring the whole of the UK to a standstill but guess what, our BA Gatwick flight left bang on time! The forecast was pretty awful for our city break, as Portugal received all the rain that then turned to snow here in the UK, but it could in no way spoil our break and the charm of Porto.

We opted to arrange for a private guide and we can thoroughly recommend this for any city break as the knowledge of these lovely guides is a real treat and our

guide knowing we were British took the initiative to guide us around the city on the history of the relationship between Britain and Portugal. You may find it of interest as we did that the relationship dates back to the Middle Ages, and in 1373 the Kingdom of England signed the Anglo-Portuguese Alliance, the oldest alliance in the world still in force.

Standing at the mouth of the great River Duoro, Porto is synonymous with the fortified wine that originated here. The Cellars of the great names of Porto are of British origin, names like Crofts,

Grahams and Taylors Fladgate. Taylors was my personal favourite, still family owned (no shareholders) and dates back to 1692. Their port wine is exquisite and a visit to their cellars is a must. Part of the estate, which has wonderful views of Porto, is The Yeatman Hotel a 5-star deluxe hotel with a Michelin restaurant that has to be experienced.

Porto is a hilly labyrinth of narrow cobbled streets which meander down to the river's edge which is buzzing with café's, restaurants and there is a tramway all along the seafront with the most delightful trams that have come over from San Francisco, great fun.

We stayed for 4 nights and during our visit we walked our feet off, climbed endless hills and even saw the famous bookshop that JK Rowling used to visit during her time in Porto teaching English, and the famous staircase in Harry Potter film was the very staircase of this bookshop.

You can travel from Porto by a really efficient train service, which links many of the other historical cities and you can depart from the Sao Bento station in the centre of the city. Standing in the main hall of this beautiful building (*above*) is a bit like being inside a gigantic crockery cabinet. An experience you don't get very often on public transport, so making it a worthy entry onto the list of transport beauties.



I would like to end this 'blog' by saying that Porto is one the best value cities I have visited. An example, is a really high-class Patisserie in the city centre serving 2 cappuccinos and a couple of their delicious custard tarts for a mere 4 euros (about £3.50)!



His programme will include Bach's *first Partita*, Beethoven's dramatic sonata the *Appassionata*, and Chopin's brilliant *sonata in B minor*. He will finish his recital with one of Liszt's *Hungarian Rhapsodies*, the one nicknamed *Carnival in Pest*, a passionate and highly virtuosic piece using Hungarian folk melodies which Liszt treated in characteristic gypsy style.

The King's Men will be presenting a concert of music, both old and new, in their own distinctive style, at Westcott. The King's Men is a close-harmony group formed from the choral scholars of King's College, Cambridge. The members sing in the college chapel choir - famed especially for its carol service at Christmas - and separately they organise their own programme of concerts around the country and abroad.

The lunchtime concert at **St Martin's church** is entitled Classical Folk and will be given by Sylvia Akagi (flute and vocal), Andrew Wickens (violin) and Peter Golden (guitar).



Letter from the Rector

When I prepare couples for their weddings, I always tell them that in human terms there is no greater gift than a man and a woman giving themselves to each other in marriage.

I encourage them to take on board the affirmation that brings, to build them up in areas of low self-esteem because we all have issues of one kind or another. In human terms there is no greater gift, but sometimes couples fail to take on board that great affirmation.

In divine terms there is of course a greater gift, the gift of God in Jesus Christ given to us the gift of forgiveness (taking our punishment away) and the gift of the Holy Spirit (His Presence with us).

As we receive that gift and Jesus' commitment to us we should take on board the affirmation that brings and the healing that is administered to our low self-esteem and to our issues. Not only does Jesus' Father become our Father – our Heavenly Father – but He really, really loves us!

He loves us and as is often said He loves us too much to leave us as we are! Or in other words He wants to bring restoration to us, He wants to make us more into the people He really intended us to be – to restore our original design. God wants to restore us, and He will – if we co-operate.

I love stories of amazing cars found in barns or garages that are then restored. In 2010 an Automotive Museum in California, bought a 1936 Bugatti Atlantic from the family of a British car collector. It had lain unused in his garage since 1960 and needed lots of restoration, but it set a new record, selling for 30 million dollars.



I bought a VW Beetle once (my first car) which needed a complete engine rebuild – luckily, I had a friend who was a VW mechanic and it was the sweetest engine to drive afterwards.

Letter from the Rector (Continuation)

Listen to these words from Isaiah 61, words with which Jesus began His public ministry: (1) The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, (2) to proclaim the year of the LORD's favour and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, (3) and provide for those who grieve in Zion to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called mighty oaks, a planting of the LORD for the display of his splendour.

That is the kind of restoration that God is interested in – even better than a restored Bugatti... a man or woman who knows their sins are forgiven and a man or woman who knows God is with them. A man or woman who knows they are loved and who can gradually begin to live out of that love.






