



MODEST EXTENSIONS TO RURAL VILLAGES

MVDC are in the process of reviewing the Local Plan in the context of their initiative on "Modest extensions to Rural Villages". At the Public meeting of BHNC in March, a representative of MVDC planning department attended to explain what this might mean for Box Hill.

As an authority, MVDC are required by Government to identify land for in excess of 5000 additional new homes in Mole Valley. If they fail to do so, control of planning may be taken away from them and dealt with by Central Government with little or no local knowledge or understanding of the area.

Whilst it is understood that due to the nature and location of Box Hill, MVDC would not be looking at the Village for the purpose of creating a large new development, they are looking at addressing certain anomalies in the Local Plan. In this context we have been asked to identify what we consider to be the "Village" and potentially what should be included in the "settlement area".

BHNC has subsequently met and with regard to the first question, we concluded that the Village is in effect from the Old Police House to the East of the Tree to the Smith and Western at the other end.

With regard to the settlement area, we concluded that within this village area all the current residential properties and their gardens should be treated as part of the settlement area with fields, woodland and other green areas attached to those properties or in between them owned privately or by the NT excluded. Also excluded (as is presently the case) would be the mobile home sites which avoids the pressure for redevelopment and potential loss as affordable housing.

What would be the effect of extending the settlement area?

Firstly, for the owners of properties currently outside the Settlement area which are subsequently included, it should be easier to get permission for minor extensions and building works which may in the past have been refused. Against this it will open up the possibility of limited infill where properties abut the highway subject to any additional properties being in keeping, meeting requirements of the ANOB and Green belt. This may be seen positively as better land use or negatively depending on your opinion.

Ultimately the decision on any changes will rest with MVDC and they will put that out for Public consultation.

RAF veterans reminisce at Crawley as service chalks up centenary

More than thirty RAF veterans, their families, friends and support organisations, were treated to a tea party and reminiscence session on Thursday 5 April at Crawley Library. The special event marked the centenary of the RAF which was formed largely from the Royal Flying Corps on 1 April 1918. At the time it was the world's largest, with nearly 23,000 aircraft, and the first air-force to be independent of army and navy forces. Veterans, including regulars and National Servicemen, from the Second World War through to the 1960s, plus cadets from more recent times, took part.

Memories of tough training regimes, excitement and boredom, sad and funny times, all were explored during an entertaining afternoon. What all agreed on was the RAF had given them a sense of purpose, self-discipline, comradeship, organisation and resilience.

Most said that military service had changed their lives for the better. Participants described the event as: "A really fascinating afternoon, thank you so much for arranging it."

Future Mole Valley – Box Hill Modest Extension to Rural Villages

Following the Public Meeting of the Box Hill Neighbourhood Council (BHNC) on 5th March, I

subsequently attended a meeting of the BHNC Committee at which the response to Mole Valley District Council (MVDC) was discussed and subsequently submitted. The main questions raised by MVDC was the identification of the Village and the Settlement area in which some modest infilling may be allowed.

The response to MVDC stated that the BHNC Committee concluded that the Village is in effect from the Old Police House (third property eastwards of The Tree) to the Smith & Western at the western end. The Settlement Area within the Village was identified as being the existing residential properties with their gardens (but excluding fields & woodland) along both sides of Boxhill Road, the western side of Ashurst Drive and both sides of Headley Heath Approach. The mobile home parks would remain excluded to avoid their potential loss as affordable housing.

I and the BHNC will keep you updated of responses from MVDC who forward the final proposals for the Local Plan covering whole district of Mole Valley to HMG Planning Inspectorate for approval.

DOG GROOMING DAYS

PARASITE CONTROL

Thought I would mention something on parasite control. We sometimes see dogs with certain parasites, not just on their body, but when we take them out for a toilet break.

Internal parasites are roundworm, tapeworm, lungworm. These are the more common. Other worms are hookworm, fox lungworm, heartworm and whipworm. Internal parasites live, feed and breed inside your pet's internal organs. Many are contracted by ingesting poo, fleas, slugs, snails, mice etc. Also, what may get on their paws and they lick themselves clean. The risk to your pet can be fatal if not treated on a regular basis or by catching the problem early enough if they are showing signs of internal parasites.

Did you know that a single roundworm can lay up to 85,000 eggs per day! Also, did you know that although slugs and snails can carry lungworm, so can their slime.

External parasites are fleas, ticks, ear mites, mange mites and biting lice. If any of these parasites bite your pet, it could cause irritation and discomfort and can lead to major problems if not treated. A female flea can lay roughly 2000 eggs during its lifetime (wonder who counted). I would like to go into more detail of all these parasites, but space will not allow me to cover all in this article, but I will mention three.

Heartworm - These worms are NOT a problem in the UK and Ireland but are a threat to any pet that travels abroad to Europe and elsewhere in the world, where there are mosquitoes. Should an infected mosquito bite your pet, then they are at risk of being infected. Should you take your pet abroad and they contract heartworm and it is left untreated, they can develop high blood pressure, heart failure, breathing difficulties and death. Cats can also be infected. The sooner the treatment, the better the outcome. Heartworm CANNOT be passed on from pet to pet only by an infected mosquito.

PARASITES – Heartworm (Continuation)

If you chose to take your pet abroad, plan well in advance to prepare for anything your pet may need, as in some cases certain preventive measures must be in your pet's system for a certain time limit before leaving the UK. Always consult your vet, even when you return to the UK.

Whipworm - These worms are rare in the UK and only affect dogs. Dogs can become infected by eating the eggs either accidentally or on purpose in other infected dog's faeces. Dogs that have a lot of these worms can show signs of diarrhoea, anaemia and reduced growth in young dogs. Again, if not treated in time, can cause death.

Hookworm - In the UK, again rare and they mainly affect dogs and rarely affect cats. Pets can become infected by ingesting infected larvae or a host containing infected larvae. This can also penetrate the skin and cause infection, usually around the paws. Symptoms may include diarrhoea, anaemia, anorexia and lethargy. As with any worms, all can be fatal eventually if not treated. This is why it is so important to regularly treat your pets for worms. Remember not all worm treatments will cover all worms. Your vet will be able to advise. I will cover the more common worms the next article.






some lovely recipes included.

Computer User's Corner

GDPR coming soon!!

(General Data Protection Regulation)

On the 25th May 2018 every business in UK (and Europe) will have to comply with the new GDPR Legislation. That is every business - there is no hiding place. Not knowing is not an excuse. If you as a business hold personal information about another person, you must comply with GDRP; failure to do so could result in a fine of up to 3% of global turnover or a fine up to 20 million Euro's. GDPR legislation replaces our aged Data Protection Act on 1998 and 1995, so this really brings us up to date and offers protection for the future.

It is easy to think GDPR doesn't affect you because you are a window cleaner or taxi driver, but this may not be the case. In short if you keep any data which could identify a person you will need to comply with GDPR. This could be a payroll record, or an enquiring potential customer.

If you use a mailing list of prospects or customers- to comply with GDPR you have to seek positive confirmation from the person whose information you hold, stating that they have granted you permission to have their email address for the intended use, like sending of product updates.

You are expected to protect the data people have provided you. If your computer uses an out of date operating system, which no longer has any security updates available, like Windows XP that retired in 2014, you are in breach of GDPR as you have failed to take reasonable care of the data, or if you do not have any regularly updated internet security, you are in breach as you have not taken sufficient care of users data. If you are aware that your company has become victim to a data breach you must inform the owners of the data within 72 hours of the breach.

As a consumer you have the rights to ask any European based company, who is holding your data, to reveal what information they hold about you, they must respond to this request within a month. Also, you can request to have your data amended or deleted, and they must comply within a month.

This is far from a complete breakdown of what GDPR means, but if you have any presence in the digital world, this is something you need to know more about.

Operating systems that have already stopped being supported include Windows XP, Mac Lion & Snow Leopard, Mac Yosemite and Windows Vista. Future life expiry dates are Mac El Capitan (end 2018), Mac Sierra (Sept 2019), Windows 7 (2020) Windows 8 (2023) and Windows 10 (2025).

Places to Visit: Lymington in Hampshire



Lymington Quay Marina with the Ship Pub in the background

The historic town of Lymington offers plenty for the visitor to the New Forest. This colourful coastal town is an ancient seaport with a rich maritime history.

Situated on the west bank of the Lymington River, on the edge of the Solent, Lymington is a major yachting centre with three marinas.

The town began as an Anglo-Saxon village and is recorded in the Domesday Book as 'Lentune'. From the Middle Ages and up to the 19th century, Lymington was well-known for its salt making and from the early 19th century a thriving ship building industry.

Much of the architecture you see today in Lymington is Georgian and Victorian. The High Street, which looks predominantly Georgian, is in fact made up of an eclectic mix of Georgian, Victorian, Art Deco with some traces of Medieval architecture.

At the top of the High Street sits the Church of St Thomas. A church has been at this location since the mid-thirteenth century and parts of the current church date back from the early thirteenth century. This Grade II Listed building was badly damaged during the English Civil War, when Puritans occupied it. Over subsequent centuries architectural additions have been added to the building including the tower and cupola. Within the church take a look at the magnificent glass doors and needlework.

With its strong maritime connections, it doesn't come as a surprise to learn that Lymington was once famous for smuggling. The vicar of the Church of St Thomas once used to allow smugglers to store their contraband within the church's tower!

Peace Celebrations Parade, Dorking

'Dorking 1918': Our summer exhibition opens on 24th May, the last in the Museum's five-year WW1 centenary project and focused on the end of the war. It concentrates on how the news was received and how it was celebrated, how the dead were commemorated, and the long-term impact of the war on the community, economically and socially. It also looks at those whose lives were changed for ever – particularly those who were disabled, could no longer work or were affected in other ways. The digital screen will scroll through biographies of nearly 1000 local casualties from Dorking and the villages and biography panels outside the Museum will feature individuals who experienced or did something significant in or following 1918.

Another centenary: The extraordinary local suffrage campaigners, the Pethick-Lawrences, feature in a short film currently showing in the Museum to celebrate the centenary of Votes for Women. The film was largely shot at the couple's former home, The Dutch House in South Holmwood, at Dorking Museum and on Leith Hill. The film can be viewed at the Museum during opening hours or on the Museum website. The Museum has also successfully raised funds for a blue plaque to be mounted on The Dutch House. Kathy Atherton's book, "Suffragettes, Suffragists and Antis – the Fight for the Vote in the Surrey Hills", The Cockerel Press, £10, is on sale at the Museum.

The WeAreDorking Quilt: The 'WeAreDorking Quilt' has gone on display at the Museum and is part of Dorking's rich 'living history'. It was made in 2017 by the children of Dorking Nursery School, which next year celebrates its 80th anniversary. The WeAreDorking 'community quilt' mobile art project was part of a campaign to inform the wider community about the school and to raise awareness of the benefits that it has brought to the children of Dorking for generations. In creating the quilt, the School worked with local business-owner Gillian Harris of Gilliangladrag Fluff-atorium. The title WeAreDorking was chosen to affirm the special bond that the School has with the community. Each block of the quilt represents something special about the School.

The Museum is pleased to be able to feature this locally made artefact for a short period, and, in conjunction with the School, we will be organising a series of community art workshops for children in May 2018. Watch out for further details.

'A New View of Dorking': This is the last chance to see our spring exhibition in association with Capel Camera Club, which will close on 19th May. It offers some stunning local images celebrating our market town and the surrounding villages and countryside. Spend a while looking at the varied images, read about their creators and their inspiration, and vote for your favourite images.

Walks and tours: The Museum's programme of guided walks and tours encompass different aspects of the town's history and heritage. Town centre walks show often unexpected sights of the town's rich heritage or of both present and 'long lost' town centre pubs. On the edges of the town, take the Deepdene Trail through the newly rejuvenated and historic Deepdene Estate, including exclusive entry to the grade II* listed Hope family mausoleum. Or you can take a trip under the streets of Dorking to explore the famous 17th century South Street Caves.

All walks and tours are open for group bookings at a time to suit you, and there are regular Open Days for individual bookings. In May, we offer:

- Saturday 5th May, Town Centre Heritage Walks from the Museum: at 3.30pm for families with children and 6pm for all;
- Sunday 13th May, The Deepdene Trail, 2pm from the Trail entrance;

The Beach at Dreams Tulum Resort & Spa

I have been lucky enough to visit the Riviera Maya twice, and would definitely return again. Situated on the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico, it really does have something for everyone.

If you are a fan of the beach you are totally spoilt with the powder white sand and the brilliant turquoise blue of the Caribbean seas (which is like getting in a very warm bath!). Some of the best beaches in the world can be found here. A coral reef stretching down the coastline is second only in size the Great Barrier Reef, and marine life is plentiful - whale sharks, dolphins and turtles call this home. If you are after something quite different there is an underwater sculpture museum between the coast of Cancun and Isla Mujeres. Getting wet is not optional!

Staying with the water theme, you can also swim in many of the Cenotes in the area (these are collapsed sinkholes in limestone rock, exposing fresh, cool underground water), very refreshing after a day in the sun!

The standard of hotels in this area is very high, with some world class restaurants and excellent service.

We stayed at the Dreams Tulum resort in the south which was fantastic. There are 9 restaurants, a café (I loved their cortados), 2 swimming pools, water sports and other activities if you want them — it is also fine to do absolutely nothing should you so wish!

Magnificent Mexico (Continuation)

The 'all inclusive' package is very extensive, you really can have pretty much anything you could wish for. The grounds of the hotel are beautiful and very lush.

Dreams Tulum resort is near to Xel Ha ecological park (a large natural aquarium) and to the Mayan ruins at Tulum — my favourite. The setting, on a clifftop overlooking a beautiful beach is truly stunning. Tip — take your swimming costume when you visit as you can go in the sea to cool off.

Tulum is a sleepy town with a hippy vibe, on yet another fabulous beach. It is very different to Cancun in the north, which is very lively. The resort of Playa del Carmen, which is about half way down the coast, is also very popular, with Fifth Avenue having lots of shops and restaurants. It is also the place to catch a boat to Cozumel, which is renowned for some great snorkelling and diving.

No trip to the Mayan Riviera is complete without a trip to Chichen Itza, one of the wonders of the modern world. You can either book a day trip from the coast resorts or hire a car and drive yourself there — as we did. It is a fascinating place, although some of the history is a little gory! Tip - go early in the day, before the sun gets too high. It is the only place we have walked round with a large umbrella to keep the sun off!

We also managed a trip to the legendary Coco Bongo, the nightclub made famous from the film 'The Mask' – that certainly was an experience not to be forgotten (and we are never going to be short of a dinner party story!).

There are several orchestral concerts in and around Dorking in May. The young and very talented musicians of the Yehudi Menuhin School will be visiting Dorking, with a programme including Vaughan Williams' *Fantasia on a theme of Thomas Tallis*, a magnificently resonant work for string orchestra. They will also play Vivaldi's *concerto for two cellos*, the *Elegy for viola and strings* by Herbert Howells, and an arrangement for string orchestra of Schubert's quartet *Death and the Maiden*.

The Dorking Chamber Orchestra will play Mozart's overture to his dramatic opera *Don Giovanni*, Mendelssohn's *Italian symphony*, and Malcolm Arnold's rarely-heard but very exciting *viola concerto*. The Surrey Philharmonic Orchestra, performing in



Ashtead, will play the overture to Mozart's fantasy opera *The Magic Flute* and Brahms' beautiful second symphony. They will be joined by soloist Yoanna Prodanova for Dvořák's cello concerto, a work full of Czech passion and lyricism.

There are three screenings at the Dorking Halls this month. First comes Kenneth MacMillan's version of *Manon*, based on a story already used for opera by Massenet and Puccini. This is broadcast live from the Royal Ballet with a repeat screening a few days later. The Broadway musical *An American in Paris*, with music and lyrics by George and Ira Gershwin, will be relayed direct from London's West End.

May's lunchtime recital at St Martin's church will feature a welcome return visit from Martin Ellis,

the former organist and director of music at the church. He is also the president of the William Cole Trust, a fund which is supported by donations at these concerts and which helps young musicians at St Martin's.



On 4th May, Polesden Lacey will launch a new programme, Power Play, exploring the social power of inimitable Edwardian socialite Margaret Greville.

From quiet beginnings as the illegitimate daughter of

a wealthy Scottish brewer, Maggie (as she was known to her friends) rose up the

social ladder to become an influential member of high society, counting the likes of King Edward VII among her close friends.

Maggie (pictured right) was known for hosting lavish parties, with guest lists that included not just celebrities and names of the day, but royalty, politicians and ambassadors – powerful people from around the world.

Kenneth Clark remarked of her 'She was immensely rich and the only hostess who had any



political power ... She sat back in a large chair, a Phoenician goddess, while the cabinet minister or ambassador leant forward attentively. I have no doubt she had considerable influence.'

Including talks, tours and exhibitions, Polesden Lacey's new programme will explore how Maggie became so influential, and more importantly, how she took advantage of her influence and power.

Visitors will be able to explore rooms throughout the house, from the extravagantly decorated entertaining rooms on the ground floor, to guest bedrooms on the first floor and the recently-renovated exhibition suite.

Interactive activities throughout the house will bring the stories to life. Visitors will be able to design the perfect guest list, listen to guests' reminiscences and see clips of the entertainers who performed at Maggie's parties.

Power Play is part of the National Trust's Women and Power programme, exploring women's lives, voices and achievements, marking 100 years since the Representation of the People Act granted some women the right to vote.

Letter from the Rector

In many ways in our culture we struggle to depend on God. We are trained to be independent and self-sufficient and we like to be "self-made" to varying degrees... but God wants us to learn to trust Him and entrust ourselves to Him fully.

If we are going to grow in that direction we will do so in the school of prayer, not the "God bless..." formula prayer of childhood, but the gut wrenching prayer when all is not well, the prayer when we know we cannot fix things ourselves and cannot get by without God.

In Psalm 62 v8 David says: "Trust in him at all times, you people; pour out your hearts to him, for God is our refuge." Isn't that the most marvellous advice "Pour out your heart to God!"

David knew to run to God when life was hard not run away from God... he also knew to pour his heart out before God. But I well remember a young woman on a Christian Youth Camp, who found this verse so challenging. Her response was "I can't."

Perhaps many of us are like that; we want to keep what is going on in our hearts out of sight. Because in that secret place we keep our most precious hopes and dreams, our deepest fears, our heaviest burdens and disappointments, the things we are ashamed of, our darkest secrets, our angers and lusts.



But why would we not trust Him? He gave His own Son for us; he loves us and thinks we are worth it! And who do we think we are going to be shocking? Not God! If we are frightened of pouring or hearts out perhaps that is because we are in some way afraid of God, or doubtful of His love? Or it could be simply our pride getting in the way?

We are completely known by God and yet loved dearly by Him. To grow in that relationship, to go

forward in your experience of Him take the route of pouring out your heart in prayer, to the One who knows you, loves you and is waiting to hear from you!

There are going to be some great opportunities for prayer within St Andrew's - so please do take those opportunities up especially from Ascension Day (May 10th) to Pentecost (May 20th) as we join in the "Thy Kingdom Come" initiatives.

Being a Messenger of the Gospel

Every day is an opportunity.

A month ago, I felt drawn to pray for a particular friend, someone I'd prayer for on and off for a couple of years. The following day there he is arriving at the Tube station at exactly the same time as I do. It happens very rarely indeed. It could be a coincidence, but it feels like an answer to prayer. We travel in together and talk about one of the many things he knows about; Roman history. I learn a lot - among other things that centurions don't command a hundred men, but eighty divided into groups of eight who share a tent, a servant to look after them and a mule to carry the tent and the cooking utensils.

Two weeks later, there's a men's conference at my church, and I hear that he might like to come. I text that if he is up for it, I am too. It's a good day and we get to talk about our reactions to what the speakers have to say. More significantly, about two thirds of the way through, he tells me exactly where he stands in relation to God. He'd like to believe but he just doesn't. I don't happen to have a 'here's one I prepared earlier response' on the tip of my tongue, or indeed on any part of my tongue, but he has trusted me and actually, I feel honoured by that. And now I know how to pray. And I'm encouraged to do so. After all, God is on the move.

He always is.

There are all sorts of ways we demonstrate the difference Jesus makes in our lives and all kinds of ways we can serve people through our actions. But people on our frontline also need to hear that it was Jesus who made the difference to us and that Jesus is the only one who can make an eternal difference to them. He came 'to give his life as a ransom for many.' He wants to see people come to know him.




