

#### LOST PROPERTY

National changes to lost property recording came into effect on Monday 1st October - this means police forces across the UK will no longer take reports of lost items such as mobile phones, wallets, bikes and cash or bank cards.

#### **PROTECT YOUR PROPERTY**

Advice from Surrey Police to protect your home and belongings from burglars.

- Lock your doors and windows every time you leave the house, even when you're
  just out in the garden, remembering to double-lock UPVC doors
- Hide all keys, including car keys, out of sight and away from the letterbox (remember a device could be used to hook and remove keys through the letterbox) if possible keep them in a metal container
- Remove valuables from view of ground floor windows
- o Store any high value items (i.e. jewellery, passports) in a correctly installed safe
- $\circ$  Install an intruder alarm If it is to be monitored, ensure it is NSI or SIA registered
- o Install dusk to dawn outside lighting around your property
- Get a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property if you are out for long periods or away on holiday
- Leave lights and a radio/TV on in your house or on a timer to make the property appear occupied
- Make sure the fences around your garden are in good condition and ensure side gates are locked to prevent access to the rear of the property
- Secure bikes at home by locking them to an immoveable object inside a locked shed or garage

#### PROTECT YOUR PROPERTY – Advice from Surrey Police (Continuation)

- Keep ladders and tools stored away; don't leave them outside where they could be used to break into your home
- Make it hard for thieves to hide by keeping foliage and bushes trimmed and neat around the edges of your property
- Mark your property with a forensic marking product such as SelectaDNA and register your property with Immobilise
- Consider joining or forming a Neighbourhood Watch scheme

To help make our county a no-go area for burglars, Surrey Police have become a SelectaDNA force. SelectaDNA is a forensic marking product that acts as a deterrent to burglars.



## **Update: Malcolm Ladell**

Mole Valley District Councillor for Box Hill & Headley

Occasional return of Foul Fumes from the Sewer under Boxhill Road in the dip adjacent to The Glade and Chestnut Lodge

Reminder that Thames Water have stated they will give notice to residents of Headley Heath Approach and Ashurst Drive that there may be some disruption for a

short while to traffic on the day that the new large machine and storage tank of chemicals to neutralise smells are delivered to the pumping station.

The problems are not helped by items being flushed down toilets and cooking oil or fats being poured down sinks that solidify and block the sewer pipes.

Repair of fractured underground Sewer Pipe and a blockage discovered further along under Headley Heath Approach

The repairs to the sewer pipe deep down under Headley Heath Approach have (at last!) been repaired and the road resurfaced by Thames Water contractor Cappagh. According to Thames Water the repair took longer because other uncharted pipes for other services (gas and electricity) were discovered necessitating the initial access hole being refilled and a new hole dug a few feet away. Thames Water also got (and paid) their contractor, Cappagh, to repair the nearby unrelated sink hole without charge to the Headley Heath Approach residents.

Thames Water confirmed that the fracture had nothing to do with, and is separate from, the problem on Boxhill Road that has been resolved as detailed elsewhere the above article.

The unrelated blockage that occurred further along Headley Heath Approach and caused a manhole cover to lift resulting in sewerage running along the road was caused by an accumulation of items being flushed down toilets and cooking oil or fats being poured down sinks that solidify and block the sewer pipes.

Reminder of notice from Sutton and East Surrey Water Plc of 'Rolling Road Closures' in Headley spread over two years from October 2018 through to October 2020.

Because of the narrowness of most of the roads it will involve road closures and diversions but access to driveways will be maintained at all times by excavating only 100-150 metre stretches at a time; the next stretch will not be excavated until the preceding one has been refilled and re-surfaced.

Church Lane and Headley Common Road will not be closed as both are wide enough to operate an alternate one-way system controlled by traffic lights.

Rolling Road Closures in Headley spread over two years from October 2018 through to October 2020. (Continuation)

Are we adequately protected? How much of our taxes get spent on defending us and what has changed between the Mid-1980's and now

In the Mid-1980s (the last time the UK faced a major Russian threat coupled with a severe terrorist offensive inside the UK), the graphs of defence, education and health expenditure largely coincided, with 5% of GDP being spent on each. In contrast, the UK now spends 6 times on welfare (12%), nearly four times on health (almost 8%), and 2% times on education (still 5%) compared to what we spend on defence, 2%, as a proportion of GDP.

The primary duty of government is to ensure the safety of its citizens. Here are some statistics comparing 1982 with today:

In December 2017 we had just one frigate at sea (HMS St Albans) with the remaining frigates in Devonport and Portsmouth and all six destroyers in Portsmouth.

#### Are we adequately protected? (Continuation)

In September 2018, the Royal Navy retired the last of its 13 Sea King Mk7 helicopters which have powerful anti-sea skimming missiles radar, designed to give ships early warning of an attack. The replacement radar system called Crowsnest, to be fitted in up to 10 of the navy's Merlin helicopters, will not be operational for another 18 months leaving the navy's ships exposed to the type of attack the navy experienced in the Falklands when HMS Sheffield was sunk by a French supplied Exocet missile. The Wildcat, the navy's main attack helicopter, will not be provided with anti-ship missiles for 2 years, while the Harpoon missile arming the navy's warships, are expected to be axed in 2023 with no decisions yet made on a replacement. Russia and China are both developing formidable high-speed anti-ship missiles.

Ministerial rhetoric is of little use when the international situation is so disturbing. China is going global while the US is thinking about going home. Europe faces a perfect storm from Russia in the east, migration crisis in the south and political extremism bubbling above and below the democratic surface. Turkey has effectively left the NATO alliance to join Russia and Iran in trying to remake the Middle East.

Our spending on defence, security, diplomacy, intelligence, international aid and R&D comes to £62 billion a year, less than 10% of government spending. This figure should be seen in the context of defending a £19 trillion national economy. The US accounted for more than 70% of defence spending across NATO last year with a budget of \$686 billion i.e. 3.57% of US GDP. Defence spending is a source of hard and soft power. Having capable armed forces and a willingness to use them, helps keep Britain as one of the permanent five members of the UN Security Council, a status that could be under threat post Brexit.

Freedom and opportunity are dependent on national security and that security is dependent on an adequate budget which should be 3% of our GDP helping to further reduce unemployment.

#### In conclusion

Christmas and New Year celebrations will soon be upon us and I look forward to meeting up with you at the events being organised by Box Hill Neighbourhood Council. ## Fly-Tipping: Duty of Care

If you are planning work to your property, you are legally responsible for what happens to any waste that is removed from your property as a result of that work. Mole Valley District Council (MVDC) will investigate all fly-tips reported to them and if evidence is found at the site of a fly-tip that leads back to the waste removed from your property, you will be fined, and risk being prosecuted.

#### Your Waste, Your Responsibility

Every householder, business and landowner, occupier or manager has a 'duty of care' to take all reasonable measures to ensure waste is removed from their property and disposed of in a responsible and legal manner.

This includes the waste removed by any contractors or trades person working on a range of tasks such as installing a new kitchen, upgrading a workspace or having work done in your garden.

If the contractor or trades person has agreed to remove the waste created from undertaking work at your property, you have a duty of care to ensure that person or company is a registered waste carrier. To check, visit the website or call 03708 506 506.

Should you not have an agreement with or not want the contractor or trades person to remove the waste from your property, there are a number of other options available:

- Take the waste to either of Mole Valley's recycling centres: Ranmore Road in Dorking or Randalls Road in Leatherhead. Check before you travel that the centres accept the waste you have. A charge scheme was introduced at Surrey's recycling centres by Surrey County Council in September 2016, but not all nonhousehold waste items require you to pay a charge when disposing of them
- If you have had work done to your garden, MVDC offers a fortnightly garden waste service which offers an easy and convenient way to recycle all year round
- MVDC offers a collection service for bulky household items, including rubble and plasterboard
- If you believe that the waste is reusable or could be fixed, contact the Surrey Reuse Network who can collect the items and re-condition them.

If you agree that the contractor or trades person will remove the waste from your property, remember to check they are registered to do so by visiting the registered waste carrier website.

If you suspect that a contractor or trades person is not disposing your waste in a responsible and legal manner, please call the Environment Agency hotline on 0800 80 70 60 or report it online by visiting the Crimestoppers website.

## **Computer User's Corner**

### Wi-Fi everywhere, easily and cheaply

We know how frustrating it can be when your Wi-Fi signal is no longer making it to the areas you need it, or maybe the poor signal is causing the internet to run more slowly; maybe it's the kids' bedroom, the conservatory or even the lodge in the garden?

Well we may have found an ideal solution for you, using a well-established technology which is found in mobile phone transmitters, repeaters and other grid based connections, the system in question is called Mesh, and it has also been installed in large offices and hotels for many years, but due to cost limitations it hasn't really become a consumer product....until now.

The item we are specifically referring to will offer "across the property" Wi-Fi connection with minimal installation and setup. The starter kit consists of three transmitters, where one unit plugs directly into your router and replaces your existing Wi-Fi connection, the other two units (more can be added if required) can be positioned anywhere around the building, providing it can "see" one of the other



The magic of this system is in the transmitters as they have two broadcast systems inbuilt, one deals with your conventional Wi-Fi signal, the other transmitter is for your "backbone" connection. This uses a different frequency and allows transmitters to share the same Wi-Fi, and handle to Passover

of traffic as you roam from one transmitter zone to another. Sounds complex but it's all done for you, so you don't need to worry about it.

The initial configuration is carried out from an app you can download on your smart phone or tablet, where it offers some neat features like parental control- to add time restrictions on specific devices on specific days of the week, or to setup a guest network.


The starter packs are available in two models- both packs have 3 repeaters in the kit. The standard model is recommended for properties up to 300 square metres, and the more powerful kit covers up to 600 square metres. Additional devices are available to add to the kit if required. The cost of the kit is £140.00 for the standard kit, with the higher-powered kit being £205.00

Would be a worthy upgrade to solve any coverage issues before the Christmas rush!

#### When the Children Came Home. Stories of Wartime Evacuees by Julie Summers






#### Wartime Country Diaries edited by Martin Wainwright

## Stan Sulzmann Celebrates 70th Birthday with his Big Band jazz tour



Box Hill resident and Jazz Musician Stan was born in Islington in 1948, making him 70 this year! He is celebrating at the Watermill Jazz in November with his 20-piece Big Band 'Neon Orchestra'.

Stan grew up in Essex where the council were moving families after the war, returning to London in his teens. Not allowed to study music at school, Stan learned to play saxophone in his own time and by the age of fifteen was one of the original members of the National Youth Jazz

Orchestra, so he has a career in the business spanning 55 years.

Leaving school at fifteen, Stan started his working life in the insurance business but didn't last long in this 'good safe' job. In 1967, he followed his passion for jazz by getting a job in the ship's band on the RMS Queen Mary. He worked a year sailing back and forth between Southampton and New York so that he could spend the stopovers in New York at the jazz clubs. Stan got to hear the likes of Miles Davis, Dizzy Gillespie, Bill Evans and Charles Mingus.

The Mary sailed its last voyage and Stan enrolled at The Royal Academy of Music. He studied Saxophone with John Dankworth by day and at night was playing in Dankworth's band at Ronnie Scott's Jazz Club.

Stan's whole life has been spent in the music business, working in studios doing film, TV Pop and Jazz sessions, playing with the likes of Paul McCartney and Joni Mitchel, and you may have heard him as the sultry saxophone that accompanied the Poirot series. Now Stan concentrates on his love of Jazz and to celebrate his 70th has been awarded an Arts Council Grant to tour his brilliant Big Band around the country culminating at the Watermills Jazz club on 27th November.

Stans association with Box Hill started in 1998 when he and his wife and two young boys, like many Londoners, fell in love with the peace, quiet and fresh air on Box Hill and bought a quirky chalet on Ruskin's estate to escape the stress and bustle of city life. They were there until three years ago and then with the kids grown up they jumped at the opportunity to move into a bungalow on Headley Heath Approach where they are now.





Dorking Home Front 1914-1918: Since 2013, a Museum team has been exploring the experience of the war in the town and surrounding villages. In each of the centenary years the Museum has run an exhibition focussing on a different aspect of the local experience on the 'home front'. These five exhibitions will be on display together for the first time at the Armistice Day Centenary Concert in St Martin's Church at 6.30pm on 11th November. The concert, including The Mozart Requiem, will be performed by the Dorking Choral Society, conducted by David Young, with the New London Chamber Orchestra. Entry to the concert is ticket only (£16, under-16s £5 from Eventbrite.co.uk or 07799 214618).

This exhibition in the church will then be open FREE to the public throughout the following week, November 12th-16th. It explores the impact of the war on the people of Dorking and the surrounding villages from its outbreak to the Armistice and beyond. Feature panels build up a picture of a community at war, covering enlistment and recruiting, influxes of refugees and troops, the changing role of women, Dorking's time as a garrison town, the response of pacifists and anti-war campaigners, the impact of major offensives like the Somme and Passchendaele, hardships, shortages and deprivations. Biographical panels feature local figures who made unusual or significant contributions, and a digital screen presents brief biographies of nearly 900 men (and a handful of women) from the town and villages who lost their lives in the conflict.

## **DORKING MUSEUM** – What's On (Continuation)



The Rob Walker Racing Team: More people in the Dorking area will now know who Rob Walker was, as the Museum exhibition, the Centenary Festival parade and two Museum Gallery Talks have generated huge interest and brought many visitors into the area. During the 1950s and 60s Dorking was home to one of the most

successful privateer motor racing teams – The Rob Walker Racing Team. Rob's team was based in London Road, Dorking, and here the cars were developed, built and tested. Between 1958 and 1968 they beat the mighty works teams in nine Grand Prix, including three wins around the streets of Monaco.

The Museum's exhibition is open until January and focuses on the life of Rob Walker, his Pippbrook Garage and workshops in Dorking, and the team's motor racing triumphs and tragedies over 30 years. Exhibits include a unique collection of scale-replica models of Walker's racing cars that featured on the BBC Bargain Hunt programme and rare memorabilia, including a steering wheel from a Lotus 49 Formula One racing car and original copies of motor racing magazines from the period.



One of the many stories that perhaps typify the man was in 1939, when he fulfilled a childhood dream, entering his Delahaye (pictured above) in the world-famous 24-hour sports car race at Le Mans with Ian Connell as co-driver. For his evening driving stint Rob, always the gentleman, chose to wear a dark blue pinstripe suit, before changing the next morning into an informal Prince of Wales' check. When Connell dropped out, Rob took over and drove a twelve-hour stint to the finish. Near the end of the race his pit crew called him in for a glass of champagne to give him energy. Rob finally crossed the line in eighth place overall and third in his class. The Delahaye had run for 24 hours without a change of tyres at an average speed of 78 mph.





### Letter from the Rector

November has bonfire parties, Services of Remembrance and winter moves in.

We have two special services on 11/11/18 as Armistice day falls on a Sunday and as we celebrate the 100th anniversary of the end of WW1. There is a 10.15am morning service at St Andrew's, and a 6.45pm evening

service at St Mary's, with Bells & Beacon lighting. Do come along.

A street poet has written "History repeats itself, it has to, no one listens." It matters that we listen, that we uphold the rule of law and protect peace and freedom in this land, treasuring the gift that we have been given and not giving it up. I often think at this time of remembering incredible sacrifice about our peace with God. Well as we recognise the price paid for us (and say "Yes" His death was for ME) we not only see our need for His death, we see that we need to receive the gift of forgiveness and treasure it.

I wonder if you recall a story from the news over thirty years ago? It concerns a Japanese officer Lt. Onoda, who in 1944 was sent to the remote Philippine island of Lubang to conduct guerrilla warfare. The trouble was that he took 29 years to believe that the war had ended. Leaflet after leaflet was dropped. Newspapers were left. Photographs and letters from relatives were dropped. Friends spoke out over loudspeakers. But Onoda continued to live in the jungle, he finally emerged from the dark recesses of the island on March 19, 1972. He surrendered and was pardoned. He was free.

There are some people in this world a bit like him who seem not to want peace with God. Some of them say that they do not believe in Him. There are others who think they can work something out on their own. But there are others who would love peace with God and do not know that Jesus has made it possible!

For anyone in that position there is good news. For as we surrender to God and make our peace with Him we discover our pardon has been purchased for us. We simply say SORRY to God for our rebellion and sin, THANK YOU to Jesus for dying for us and PLEASE to the Holy Spirit to come into our hearts and lives... and the gifts He brings are forgiveness and new life as children of God.

Looking forward we have a chance to see the Alpha film series in St Andrew's from January 9th and we have the St Andrew's 50th Birthday celebrations in February.

You will be warmly welcomed at both!


