



FREE FESTIVE PARKING IN MOLE VALLEY

Free parking sessions for Christmas across Mole Valley are confirmed for the festive season! From 12 midday on Saturday 2nd, 9th and 16th December, shoppers will park free of charge in any of Mole Valley District Council owned car parks.

Additional free parking sessions will run in Dorking from 3pm for the Gala Night on 7th December, in Bookham from 3pm for the late-night shopping event on 14th December and in Ashtead from 3pm on 5th December.

DEVELOPMENT OF HOTEL AT DENBIES

Work started at Denbies Wine Estate in September to develop a 17-room hotel and it is expected to be complete in time for spring of next year.

The existing farmhouse bed and breakfast will be developed into a fully-fledged hotel, complete with a new bar and restaurant that will "champion" local produce.

Among the features of the new hotel will be the ability to taste Denbies full range of wines from Enomatic machines that will be linked to room key cards, dining spots with views over the vineyards and access to the seven miles of public footpath threaded in and around the estate which includes part of the North Downs Trail and Box Hill.

Denbies' Chief Operations Officer, Jeannette Simpson, commented: "We have a wonderful site here at Denbies which attracts around 350,000 visitors each year. We have been at the forefront of wine tourism in England since the estate opened and our new hotel, due to open in spring 2019, will be a great addition to our existing hospitality offering.

"The reputation of English wine continues to grow, and wine tourism is an integral part of communicating this message loud and clear. We look forward to offering a world-class vineyard and winery experience here in the heart of the Surrey Hills."

In addition to the hotel, Denbies is investing several million into a "complete modernisation and expansion of the winery" that will allow it to "quadruple" its production, according to CEO Christopher White.

He continued: "Moreover, our sustained programme of new plantings, as well as planned winery investments, will enable us to expand while continuing to drive the quality of our sparkling wines. We will also make sure that we support growing demand for our full range of still wines, from entry level up to the premium ranges." "Extensive" plantings have been underway at the estate throughout 2017 and 2018, including the introduction of six new varieties as part of a programme to expand the estate's top end range.



Headley Village Stores & Tea Room Robbery

On Thursday afternoon 8th November, the business proprietors Julie Ho-A-Shoo and her son Glen, and their customers at the time in the Headley Village Hall Store and Tearoom had the terrifying experience of a robbery by two masked robbers threatening

them with a 'gun'. Although the gun subsequently turned out to be a plastic imitation, it would not have been that obvious to everyone at the time.

The Police responded promptly and with the aid of CCTV recordings and descriptions given by Glen and other witnesses the robbers were identified as also having carried out a failed attempted robbery in Capel that morning and a robbery in Redhill on Tuesday 6th November.

At the time of writing one of the robbers has been found and, having been on parole, returned to Prison.

Resolving inadequate display of Remembrance Poppies along Boxhill Road

Four residents of Box Hill complained to me and my daughter Jenny that prior to Remembrance Sunday no Poppies were displayed anywhere along Boxhill Road whereas other villages and towns had large numbers of Poppies on display ready for the 100th Year of Remembrance since the end of the 1914-18 World War.

I explained that Mole Valley District Council provided the Poppies for the towns and also those to the Parish Councils such as Headley Parish Council who pay for them out of the Parish Council Tax that is added to, and collected via, the MVDC Council Tax.

Nevertheless, I was embarrassed by my oversight particularly as your District Councillor I obtain and lay the Remembrance Wreaths at St Andrew's and St Mary's churches thus I contacted both the MVDC and the British Legion who had many weeks ago sold out of the large Poppies for attaching to lamp posts etc. Jenny was able to buy the remaining few unsold 'street size' poppies from the British Legion stall in the Banstead Waitrose which we attached to the lamp post at the bus stop opposite Hilltop Stores and also on the lamp post opposite St Andrew's Church and the Village Hall. Jenny also persuaded the owner of the Flowerpot florist in Tadworth to make two small wreaths from their remaining poppies and sprigs of holly leaves which we attached to the 'gates' along Boxhill Road.

Resolving inadequate display of Remembrance Poppies (Continuation)

I will suggest to the Box Hill Neighbourhood Council (BHNC) that they take over responsibility for ordering and paying the British Legion for Remembrance Poppies and Wreaths respectively for attaching to the few lamp posts and also the Village Gates along Boxhill Road. In this regard, I remind you that the BHNC is organised and run by unpaid volunteers who rely upon the support of Box Hill residents to contribute donations towards the costs of events including the decorated Christmas Tree and Lights, Santa Parade, etc.

EU Brexit hiccups

I would imagine that like me, and regardless of whether you voted Remain or Leave, you are feeling confused, frustrated and even despondent at the slow and uncertain progress of the negotiations. Even if we accept the negotiated EU offer on the table, at the time of writing this, it still has to be approved by all 27 member states that comprise the European Union.

The UK joined the European Economic Community (EEC) in 1973 and when the 1976 Referendum was held, I voted 'Yes' to remain. The EEC was, as its name implies, an economic (i.e. commercial trade) agreement removing burdensome import/export documentation and tariffs. It was a success that has benefitted the UK and all the other member states.

The EEC was changed over the years by agreements between the member states to become the European Union (EU) without direct public consultation and approval. This has resulted in ever increasing powers being granted to, and by, the burdensome and costly European Parliament and Courts well beyond commercial activities between the member states that interfere with and frequently overrule our Courts. These changes are what I object to and the reason why I voted 'Leave' in the 2016 Referendum.

It occurs to me that the individual States of the United States of America seem to have more power over their internal affairs than the UK will have over its affairs if it remains in the EU.

Rolling Road Closures in Headley from now until October 2020

Because of the narrowness of most of the roads, it will involve road closures and diversions. Church Lane and Headley Common Road will not be closed as both are wide enough to operate an alternate one-way traffic lights system.

DOG GROOMING DAYS

Well another year gone - far too quickly! I have been most fortunate with customers and my business being kept busy, when as I mentioned in a previous article, some clipping businesses having closed. I was told (not sure how

true it is) that those clipping business where the groomer has a lot of experience, they are still going. It appears to be more the younger groomers, especially those that work on their own, as they found the work difficult. This I can understand, because if you get a difficult dog, you do actually need 2 pairs of hands, but then when I started out, I was on my own and I would either get a friend to help or the dog's owner. There is usually a way around the problem but learning how to clip dogs in a school is completely different to actually running your own business and dealing with customers. In most training schools, you do not actually get to meet the customers. I was lucky, as I learnt on site and when I left where I worked, the new owners did not want a clipping business, so the customers came with me, so I did not have to build up a business, I already had one. In addition, many of the veterinary practices at that time knew me so well and would often send customers to me. I was lucky.

My contribution is Becky can do the hand-stripping on my premises, use the parlours water, shampoo and electric at no cost to her and I cover Becky for insurance. A couple of customers had forgotten we do no hand-stripping in December and tried to get an appointment, so this is just a reminder. Also, Becky only does small and medium dogs - no large.

Greyhound Lifeline: We are still collecting items for this charity, as we do all through the year, but more so at Christmas for those dogs that have no home to celebrate a family Christmas in. Therefore, we are after used postage stamps, unused bin bags, tins of pilchards in tomato sauce, washing up liquid and goodies suitable for the Greyhound. Desmond Victor Langley

29.7.1929 - 19.11.2018

Des and Beryl moved to Box Hill from Bookham 21 years ago, and very quickly became involved in local activities. They joined the very small congregation at St Andrew's church and regularly attended the 9 o'clock service on a Sunday morning. For a short time, Des was churchwarden, which covered various duties at both St Andrew's and St Mary's. When the Friends of St Andrew's was formed Des was on the Committee and took part enthusiastically in all the fundraising activities that took place.

Des was a journalist and during his working life he edited a number of trade journals – and indeed he carried on with his journalistic ventures after he retired, having a number of features published in magazines such as The Lady. He was asked to edit the Parish Magazine, but instead opted for the *Box Hill News*, making it the professional looking magazine that it still is today. Des edited the Box Hill News from 2001 to 2007, and after he retired as Editor, he was Chairman for another 4 years.

Des's overriding passion was gardening. As a boy he helped his father and his grandfather in the garden and his enthusiasm for gardening never waned. During his married life he created two and renovated two gardens established ones - all to Beryl's design. Beryl looked after the flowers - Des's pride and joy was his greenhouse and his vegetable patch. The first time he entered his vegetables in the Headley Show he not only picked up first prize for his peas and his beans, but his beautiful peas won him the cup for the Best in Show. Over the next few years he regularly won first or second prizes not only for peas and beans, but also



potatoes, beetroot, cucumber, lettuce and, of course, his tomatoes.

Desmond Victor Langley (29.7.1929 – 19.11.2018) Continuation



Des and Beryl met when they both worked just off Fleet Street, Des as Editor of a magazine launched for advertisers on the new commercial TV channel, and Beryl as a secretary on a magazine for advertisers in the press. They married in February 1958. Their daughter and two sons have given them 6 grandchildren and 6 (nearly 7) great-grandchildren. Many happy hours have been spent with grandchildren roaming over Box Hill and Headley Heath.

Gradually Des's health curtailed his various activities. In October 2015 Des and Beryl moved from Woodcote, Ashurst Drive to their lovely new home on Surrey Hills. This

time it fell to Beryl to do the digging as well design the garden. Although a raised bed was made for the vegetables Des was unable to do very much. He enjoyed sitting in the garden and loved watching the birds on the feeder.



In February this year Des and Beryl celebrated their Diamond Wedding Anniversary, but in April Des moved into the Red House in Ashtead as it became too difficult for Beryl to care for him at home. Since then he has been looked by kind and caring staff, with daily visits from Beryl and nearby family. His family were with him when he died there peacefully on November 19th.

Beryl and all the family are very appreciative of the love and support that is being received from those who knew Des and valued his friendship over the years.

The London School of Anatomy has accepted Des's body and it has been received by St George's Hospital, enabling medical students to gain the knowledge they need.

There will be a Memorial service to celebrate Des's life at St Andrew's on Sunday, 13th January at 12noon.

Tributes to Des Langley - former Box Hill News Editor

Des Langley was the sort of person one needs in a small village like Box Hill – he entered into the life of the village with enthusiasm and dedication, giving of his time and experience to enhance the lives of others. He had a keen sense of



humour, was a great story teller, and kind and considerate to others although he wouldn't suffer fools gladly.

Des was Editor of *Box Hill News* for about 6 years between 2001 and 2007. When it was time to prepare an issue of the magazine, Des would take over the spare

bedroom of his home in Ashurst Drive and the bed would be covered with printed pages waiting to be proof-read and then sorted into the correct order for printing — a much more manual process than today. Without Des' knowledge and experience of producing a magazine, *Box Hill News* wouldn't be where it is today. Thank you, Des.

Des passed away after the copy deadline for this issue so there was limited time to submit tributes, but the following have been received in time for inclusion.

June Austin, former Editor of Box Hill News, wrote:

I had the pleasure of working with Des during my five-year stint as Editor of Box Hill News after his own retirement from this role. I met him for the first time shortly before moving to the Hill in December 2006. We worked together for six months while he showed me the ropes before I finally took over the Editors reins in June 2007. Des proved to be a wonderful teacher, with oodles of patience which came no doubt from his many years of experience as a professional journalist. Each Christmas, Des and his wife Beryl would put on a lovely spread for the Box Hill News team which gave us the chance to socialise together and swap stories about our lives. Des loved his holidays in Tenerife and would often regale me with stories about his youth and grandchildren. He also loved to garden – and even had a chandelier in his shed! Des was that very rare thing – a true old-fashioned gentleman who never had a cross word to say about anyone – although I am sure he had his moments in private! He was a fount of wisdom and support to me during my years as Editor, and someone who I came to regard as a very dear friend who will be very sorely missed.







Will you be keeping up the old local traditions this Christmas? In 'Recollections of Old Dorking', written about life in the town nearly two centuries ago, Charles Rose tells of St Thomas's Day on December 21st, 'Gooding Day', when the poor went about 'gooding' – asking for alms – and children who raced to school before the teacher were allowed to lock him out and avoid lessons. The Town Band played for some

nights before Christmas outside the grander houses and Christmas Eve "was a time of great merriment and activity, and I am sorry to add of no little intemperance". Christmas Day "was ushered in by the ringing of the church bells and the strains of the band" – mostly sacred tunes, although he did also recall them playing "Get up! Get up! and put the pudding in the pot". The Christmas dinner table was "the happy place of family gatherings" and "Christmas merry making and a generous hospitality everywhere prevailed". Happy merry making!

Gallery Talk, Thursday 13th December: "The money behind the militant movement": On the centenary of the general election of December 1918 when women could vote for the first time, Kathy Atherton will talk about Emmeline and Fred Pethick-Lawrence of Holmwood and their contribution to the suffrage movement. She also celebrates Emmeline as one of the first women to stand for parliament at that election – her platform, her team and her (unsuccessful) campaign – and why Fred did not stand despite being desperate to get into Parliament (which he did in 1923). At Dorking Museum, 7pm, doors open 6.30, entry £5 on the door, includes a glass of Prosecco. Seating is limited, but some standing room is available. Bookable through the Museum website.

A short film telling the story of the Pethick-Lawrences, filmed in Dorking, Holmwood and Leith Hill, is still available to view in the Museum to mark the centenary of the vote for women (any time during opening hours). Kathy Atherton's book on the fight for the vote in the Surrey Hills is also on sale.

The Rob Walker Racing Team: The Rob Walker Centenary Festival parade of historic racing cars around Dorking in October attracted a lot of attention and visitors to the town and was widely considered a great success. Certainly, more people now know who Rob Walker was and how the Dorking area figured in his success in the 1950s and

1960s. One of the most successful privateer motor racing teams, they were based in London Road, Dorking, and here the cars were developed, built and tested. Between



1961 Monaco Grand Prix: Stirling Moss in pole position (No. 20)

1958 and 1968 they beat the mighty works teams in nine Grand Prix, including three wins around the streets of Monaco.

Although a number of prominent drivers raced in Rob Walker colours, most successful was Stirling Moss. He agreed to drive for the Dorking-based team in 1958, the deal sealed with nothing more than a handshake.

Moss was victorious in that year at Argentina in only the team's third overseas grand prix. Although the underpowered Cooper was considered a bit of a joke by the big works teams, the Walker team's surprise strategy to complete the race without a tyre change won the day. Between 1958 and 1962, when a bad accident at Goodwood ended his racing career, Moss won 46 of the 90 races he drove for the team, including six further Grand Prix victories.

The Museum's Rob Walker exhibition remains open until January and focuses on the life of Rob Walker, his Pippbrook Garage and workshops in Dorking, and the team's motor racing triumphs and tragedies over 30 years. Exhibits include a unique collection of scale-replica models of Walker's racing cars that featured on the BBC Bargain Hunt programme and rare racing memorabilia.

Exhibition researcher Tom Loftus' new book, 'The Rob Walker Racing Team — Dorking's Part in Motor Racing History', tells the story from a Dorking perspective. The book, available from the Museum, features many un-published photographs and a touching foreword by Rob's son, Robbie Walker.

New exhibition: Our first exhibition of 2019 is 'Lord Ashcombe's Minerals – the gentlemen collectors and the advance of science' and opens on January 31st. More details to follow.

Florence is a must, the history, food and buzzing cafes is all a short walk away. You must visit the Santa Maria Novella pharmacy, the oldest in Italy, again started by nuns back in 1500. The small side streets, with prosecco bars, cafes and an assortment of shops keep you busy. I would recommend that you skip the queue for the

main attractions, Uffizi gallery and the Cathedrals. Take a walk along the river of Ponte Vecchio.

We then took the train to Rome in business class, again hassle free, and relaxing. On arrival into Rome, we were taken to our hotel the Sina Bernini Bristol, a hotel in the centre on Rome. 


